Discontinuation of Streptozyme Testing

SUBJECT:	Discontinuation of Streptozyme Testing

As of 10/31/2020 DLS will no longer be able to offer Streptozyme testing.

DLS was recently informed that the manufacturer of our Streptozyme test will no longer be producing this test in the U.S. Unfortunately, there are also no replacement or alternative Streptozyme tests at the present time.

Streptozyme testing typically detected the qualitative presence of one or more of the following antibodies: Antistreptolysin (ASO), Anti-hyaluronidase (AHase), Anti-streptokinase (ASKase), Anti-nicotinamide-adenine dinucleotidase (anti-NAD), and Anti-DNase B antibodies.

When screening patients for suspected Group A Strep infections, Streptozyme was often ordered in conjunction with specific ASO testing. While ASO is commonly elevated in patients with pharyngitis, it can be falsely low or negative in patients with skin infections or have been treated with antimicrobial therapy. However, as Streptozyme also checks for the presence of Anti-DNase B, and others, it would be positive in both pharyngitis and skin infections.
