**SUBJECT:** Change in Occult Blood Testing

## Effective Monday, April 27, 2009

Occult Blood testing will be changed from the Hemoccult SENSA to the Hemoccult ICT (Immunochemical Test). The new test is specific for human blood and will greatly reduce false positive results related to diet and non-human blood consumption. It will also allow for the elimination of dietary restrictions currently required for the Hemoccult SENSA test. This will encourage more compliance with specimen submissions to the clinical laboratory.

## **Test Information**

Analyte	Unit Code	Specimen Requirement
Occult Blood - Screening	602	3 specimens on separate days
Occult Blood – Diagnostic	602D	1 specimen

**Test Frequency** Daily

## Patient Information

Specimens should **not** be collected 3 days before, during, or after their menstrual period, have bleeding hemorrhoids, blood in their urine, open wounds, or if they have strained during their bowel movement.

A diet high in roughage can <u>increase test accuracy</u> by uncovering lesions which bleed intermittently.
